Blepharoplasty Instructions:

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. No alcoholic beverages for 24 hours.
- No driving, operating equipment or machinery for 24 hours.
- Do not sign any important documents for 24 hours
- Do not stay alone. You will be sleepy and need a responsible person with you for 24 hours
- 5. Rest at home for 24 hours
- Start with clear liquids and advance your Dr's ordered diet; for example after liquids, try soup and cracker, then a regular diet for supper.
- Do not take pain medication or antibiotics on an empty stomach. Eat something like crackers before taking medications.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- It is normal to experience some oozing at sutures. If this occurs, hold light pressure with gauze and keep head elevated for 5 to 10 minutes.
- Avoid strenous activity, lifting, bending or straining for two weeks. These can cause swelling and/or bleeding.
- Sleep on 2 pillows for approximatly two weeks. This will help decrease swelling and soreness. You may sleep on your side, but stay elevated so that your head is higher than your heart.
- Apply opthalmic ointment to lid stitches 2 times per day.
- Wear swiss eye mask while awake for the first 24 hours, on and off at ten minute intervals. Store mask in iced water while not wearing.

POST-OPERATIVE PHONE CALL:

Dr. Siegel will call you in the evening after your surgery. A representative from Dr. Siegel's office will also call you the day after your surgery. Do not be alarmed. This is a routine call to see how you are doing at home.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

A certain amount of nausea and occasional vomiting is normal. If it persists notify Dr. Siegel Approximately once a hour, take a deep breath, hold it for a second, then blow it all the way out Watch for heavy or prolonged bleeding. If present notify Dr. Siegel Watch for signs of infection; fever, increased pain, foul drainage. If present notify Dr. Siegel
