Liposuction Instructions:

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- No alcoholic beverages for 24 hours.
- No driving, operating equipment or machinery for 24 hours.
- Do not sign any important documents for 24 hours
- Do not stay alone. You will be sleepy and need a responsible person with you for 24 hours
- Rest at home for 24 hours
- Start with clear liquids and advance your Dr's ordered diet; for example after liquids, try soup and cracker, then a regular diet for supper.
- Do not take pain medication or antibiotics on an empty stomach. Eat something like crackers before taking medications.
- 8. Take _____ for pain.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- It is normal to have fluid escape through incisions.
 If this happens you will experience blood tinged areas on your garment. You can add gauze to the incision site.
- It will be necessary for you to wear the girdle-like garment for 24 hours a day for 1 week, then during the day for 1 to 2 weeks.
- The garment should not be removed for the first 24 hours.
- After 24 hours, the garment may be removed to shower only. Apply neosporin or bacitracin ointment on stitches and change bandaids twice daily.
- Swelling and bruising may be extensive. This is normal, and will gradually subside.
- Numbness is not uncommon in the suctioned area. You are advised to avoid excessive heat, such as heating pads, until normal sensation returns.
- The final results may not be fully appreciated for 6 months.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

A certain amount of nausea and occasional vomiting is normal. If it persists notify Dr. Siegel Approximately once a hour, take a deep breath, hold it for a second, then blow it all the way out Watch for heavy or prolonged bleeding. If present notify Dr. Siegel Watch for signs of infection; fever, increased pain, foul drainage. If present notify Dr. Siegel

POST-OPERATIVE PHONE CALL:

Dr. Siegel will call you in the evening after your surgery. A representative from Dr. Siegel's office will also call you the day after your surgery. Do not be alarmed. This is a routine call to see how you are doing at home.
